CHAIRMAN'S WELCOME

Welcome to the March Edition of All About Cleeve.

May / June will bring celebrations for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee: does anyone have photos of a Coronation /Jubilee party (a legitimate one!), if so, the All About Cleeve Committee would welcome them for the June Edition? Email photos or contact me, by phone or email, with memories. Any contributions would be really appreciated.

Following the Public Inquiry, Bristol Airport is to be allowed to expand from 10 million passengers per annum to 12 million passengers per annum. The airport predicts that it will reach 12 million passengers per annum in 2030. There are to be no more than 85,990 air transport movements in any year, this equates to an average of 232 flights daily, roughly one every three minutes. There will be more night flights in the summer months going forward as an annual limit of 4,000 night flights means the present winter flights allocation can instead be utilised during the summer months. Further growth inevitably will result in increased traffic on the A370 and other small rural roads.



ON OUR FARMS

I've been asked a few times why we have had dairy cows grazing the fields in winter and what breed they are. We have a herd of cross bred cows that are only milked once a day rather than the more conventional twice a day. Being cross bred, the cows in question are more hardy than the more 'normal' black and white cows commonly seen grazing the fields in the summer months. As such, they can withstand the colder, wetter months of winter better so stay outside rather than be housed. As long as they have some shelter such as a hedge then they are quite happy. So, the next question, why are the cows in a field miles away from a milking parlour? Dairy cows naturally have a nine to ten month lactation. At the end of that lactation her milk dries up and she naturally has a two or three month holiday ready to build up reserves ready to have her next calf. The cows grazing away from the farm are having their annual holiday before they start to calve at the start of March. The main cross of breeds is a Jersey bull crossed with a Friesian or Holstein cow. This cross produces a mature cow that is considerably smaller than the big Friesians and Holsteins we have thus allowing them to stay out on winter pasture without causing too much damage. In addition to the lighter weight, the Jersey cross cows produce milk that is a lot richer, albeit less of it. Each cow produces about 3,000 litres compared to 8,000 litres from a Friesian or Holstein with butterfat of 5.0% compared to 4.25% and protein of 4.0% compared to 3.3%. The milk is fantastic for making cheese from and with significantly lower costs incurred the cows don't need to produce as much to be profitable. With winter grazing there is some damage to the pasture but nothing that nature and a good chain harrowing and rolling won't put right. Where it looks as though the field is a quagmire, with some dry weather and sunshine the wet winter will seem and dim and distant past.

We have 250 cross bred cows to calve in March so everyone at the farm will be busy. There will be lots of baby calves to feed, cows to milk and spring cultivations to do. Long hours need to be worked to get all the work done but it is a fantastic time of year not just because of all the new calves but because spring is just around the corner with new growth, longer daylight hours and if we're really lucky, some sunshine.

CIL (Community Infrastructure Levy) Monies: The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) is a new way of collecting financial contributions from developments towards the provision of infrastructure required to support growth in North Somerset. It has been in place since January 2018 and North Somerset Council CIL charges are based on a tariff of rates that have been set through public consultation and examination by the Planning Inspectorate.

Town and Parish Councils in North Somerset will receive a proportion of the CIL funds collected from developments in their Town or Parish.

In Cleeve we have received a payment relating to the re-development of the former Lord Nelson site.

The CIL Regulations state that a Town/Parish Council must use CIL receipts passed to it in accordance with Regulation 59A or 59B to support the development of the local council's area, or any part of that area, by funding:

- (a) the provision, improvement, replacement, operation or maintenance of infrastructure; or
- (b) anything else that is concerned with addressing the demands that development places on an area.

Cleeve Parish Council are consulting the community on any ideas they may have for projects. The ideas must be:

- a) For the benefit of the community.
- b) No major infrastructure projects.
- c) Projects up to a value of £5,000.

We will also publish this request on our Facebook page and be available to discuss at parish "surgeries" when these re-commence. We will also review any issues which may arise once the new development is operational in Spring 2022.

A strategy for traffic in Cleeve: After strong representations by ourselves and our District Councillor, Steve Hogg, we have now had confirmation from Highways at North Somerset Council that the Cleeve scheme is still on their schedule. It should now be implemented in the 2022/2023 financial year.

It seems that the issues around parking are improving but it would be helpful if, in the first instance, that any illegal parking is reported to North Somerset via https://forms.n-somerset.gov.uk/ad/form/parkingillegally#/1

It is important to remember that, under the Road Traffic Act 1991, parking was decriminalised and civil enforcement of car parking regulations is now carried out by civil enforcement officers operating on behalf of North Somerset Council rather than by the Police.

As we discussed at our November meeting our Annual Parish Meeting this year will look at formulating a strategy to cover the whole of Cleeve and review speed limit options, parking, traffic calming and any other suggestions which are put forward.

Provisionally this meeting will be held in the Village Hall on Tuesday 26th April 2022. Full details will be provided nearer the time but it is intended to include our District Councillor, Steve Hogg, plus representatives of North Somerset Council and the Police.

Air Quality Monitoring: In liaison with North Somerset Council we have arranged to undertake Air Quality Monitoring particularly on the A370 in the area around the Lord Nelson/Tout's development. This is now in place and will give us a reference point ahead of the site being operational.

Allotments: Many years ago there were a small number of allotments available in Cleeve. We have had an email from a local resident expressing interest in taking an allotment on. This is likely to be a lengthy process to investigate viability, but we would be like to hear from any residents who may also be interested.

The Queen's Green Canopy: The Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) is a unique tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 which invites people from across the United Kingdom to "Plant a Tree for the Jubilee."

We are pleased to report that the tree for Cleeve (a Liquid Amber) has now been planted on Pound Green and a suitable plaque will shortly be placed alongside this.

Under the Local Authority Treescapes Funding Scheme (via the Forestry Commission) a Hawthorn tree has also been planted on Pound Green.

Additionally, 2 hawthorn and 3 oak 2 "whips" have been planted near the Goblin Combe car park.

Dog Poo!! Although most dog owners act responsibly there are still examples of instances of dog poo not always being picked up. Whilst this is, of course, anti-social it also is worth reminding dog owners that North Somerset Council have published local Public Space Protection Orders (PSPOs).

The orders state that if you are in charge of a dog you must as a minimum:

- keep your dog(s) under close control at all times
- carry a poo bag
- bag it and bin it please don't leave bags hanging in trees or bushes
- keep your dog(s) out of children's play areas.

So how can we all do our bit to help turn things around?

- Help is at hand in the form of a new free app called at https://poopersnooper.app/ get-started
- Pooper Snooper lets you highlight the problem of dog fouling wherever you are and puts dog fouling on the map! The app also allows you to record and find the location of bins so that it's easier than ever to find where to dispose of your doggy deposits.
- Communities can use this to highlight and monitor problematic areas and it is hoped that the data will better enable authorities to act, for example, by providing extra and/or better placed bins or by enabling the efforts of over-stretched dog wardens to be better targeted.

Keep Cleeve Tidy: Our Village Orderly, Caroline, does a great job in keeping the village litter free (although this is often an uphill task!). We would be interested to hear if there are any areas of the village which you feel need any special attention at any time. PLANT OF THE MONTH - CROCUS

The name Crocus is derived from the Greek work "Krókos" meaning thread, as in golden threads of saffron, and symbolises new beginnings and rebirth. Crocus are hardy and versatilegrowing at alpine heights and meadows to woodland and by the sea.

These low-growing petit perennials may be small but make a big impact. Plant en mass in groups or drifts naturalising through a lawn or trees, crocus pop their heads above ground when we are most in need of cheerful colour, paving the way for the spring bulb-fest!

They are particularly east to grow. Corms are planted in autums and flower from late winter to spring, requiring no maintenance, simply patience whilst waiting five weeks or so for their foliage to die back so the nutrients can be re-absorbed into the corm, as an energy store for next years display.

Perfect for sunny or partial shady pots, lawns and rockeries, crocus are easily squeezed into tiny spaces, so ideal for window boxes, terraces, urban or sprawling country gardens. Shallow roots allow them to happily grow under trees. Crocus require sun to open up their faces so avoid spots that are densely shaded, although *Crocus tommasinianus* will grow in part shade.

They rarely suffer from pests but corms are a favourite feast for squirrels!

If you fancy something completely different try growing your own saffron with autumn flowering *C. sativus*, planted in late summer.


