Prune early flowering shrubs back now so that they have time to make new growth and flower buds for next year. Large Forsythia can be cut back hard, flowering currants trimmed a little and Camellias can be trimmed to reshape them. Spirea arguta, Chaenomeles, winter jasmine, Kerria, Choisya and Viburnum tinus will benefit from careful pruning.

TIP FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

Treat those lawn weeds with a good lawn weed killer like Weedol Lawn Weedkiller now. This is the best time to do it. However, don't use the cut grass for composting until the fourth cut after applying weedkillers.

TIPS FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

Start feeding greenhouse tomatoes with a high potash tomato feed as soon as you can see the first visible tiny fruit.

Increase ventilation on bright days. It may be necessary to open vents very early in the morning and close late in the evening or even leave them a little open at night.

Apply shade [spray-on or netting] to the roof of your greenhouse to keep temperatures down.

Some houseplants, such as Cymbidium orchids, Yucca, Aralia, Aspidistra, ivies, ferns and Begonia can be moved outside this month for summer. Put them in a shady spot until they get used to the brighter light outside and make sure they get watered regularly.

Below is the Chairman's Report delivered at the Annual Parish Meeting on 14 April.

Cleeve Parish Council Chairman's report 2024/25

Your Council: There have been a few changes this year, we welcomed the return of Cllr Lister in June through co-option, however sadly we've recently had several resignations...

Caroline, Cleeve's village orderly has moved away, we thank her for her 8 years service and wish her & her family all the best in their new home in Cossington. We welcomed Judy Kiernan to the role on 1.4.25.

Chris Monkman's contract finished in March, he is no longer taking on ground maintenance but will be running a cafe in Cheddar, we wish him all the best... our new contract for grass cutting is with Greener Future Ground Services Ltd.

Cllr Geoff Pritchard resigned recently following a stroke, we thank him for all his help with planning applications and sharing his extensive local knowledge and wish him a speedy recovery.

Cllr Debs Lister sadly resigned after realising that since rejoining the PC it is not the right time for her.

Lastly, Cllr George Stringer resigned... although sad for Cleeve it is following a 55 year voluntary service with local government, 22 of those with Cleeve PC, we thank him for his dedication and wish him a well-deserved retirement.

In the past year the PC has responded to several NSC Consultations, most recently the local plan 2040... we responded no to all proposed potential sites for additional housing development in Cleeve.

Traffic: We have submitted 3 requests to NSC for speed reductions, we await their response.

We are hopeful the plans shown by the BSIP team tonight will be the impetus for moving our vision forward.

Finance: In January we increased the precept by 10%

We set a precept level of £19,249 which equates to £51.04 per year for a Band D property.

This was a hard decision to make but this increase will cover a rise in costs and extra financial liabilities that we have taken on in the past year following changes to NSC's delivering together program.

Planning: CPC responded to 9 planning applications last year, covering:

1 new house 4 extensions/refurbishments to existing houses

1 new outbuilding 3 others e.g advertising and retrospective

We sent a letter requesting an Environmental Impact Assessment with regards the solar farm proposal above Cleeve/Wrington

Airport: Thank you to Cllr Burn for her continued commitment attending airport meetings and keeping us informed of ongoing discussions regarding

airport dispensations, particularly those allowable for night flights and more recently the Airport master plan.

Community: This year we awarded grants of the following amounts to local

organisations:
All About Cleeve £400. Yatton United Charities £100

Open spaces: Progress is being made at the Community Orchard in the former Millennium Garden. We held another volunteer session in January to plant more fruit trees... thank you to all who donated a tree for the orchard and those who came to help.

The Future: British Telecom are wanting to remove the phone box on Pound Green. Cleeve PC can adopt the box for £1. We have had a suggestion to use it as a community library/book share, do you have any other ideas?

Whatever the converted box becomes we would need some one/people to organise and manage it... could you help?

We would also like to have some sort of community event in the orchard ... would you like an Apple day in October? An annual celebration of apples and orchards? Any ideas from village groups?... maybe have an apple pie making contest with judging and prizes? Apple activities/crafts for children?

If you would like to help, please get in touch.

Thanks: Finally, thank you to all the Councillors and our clerk for their continued hard work on behalf of the community.

Could you be a Parish Councillor?: As mentioned in the Chairman's Report, we currently have 3 Councillor vacancies on Cleeve Parish Council.
