Cleeve Court is a Grade II listed manor house, built in the 19th century for reverend T.S. Biddulph. The building had 13 hectares of parkland, a walled kitchen garden and an orchard. Cleeve Court was also home to Goblin Combe, a gorge dotted with grassland and home to over 30 species of butterfly. Within the wider area of the park there is Cleeve Toot and other hillforts some which are scheduled

GARDENING TIPS

Keep some areas of longer grass and even some weeds as wildlife sanctuaries. Piles of old logs can make a brilliant home for wildlife. A small sheet of corrugated iron may encourage slow worms and grass snakes into your garden. In return they will eat many of your pests.

CAMERA, LIGHTS ACTION!

On Monday 30th March, a group of volunteers visited Court de Wyck School to share the story of Easter with Kingfisher Class (children in year 3 and 4). The story was told through the lens of a movie set, complete with clapper boards, props, characters and a movie set map. Children visited each of the 5 locations and imagined scenes from the last week of Jesus life. They were encouraged to think about how each part of the story made them feel, and to wonder what questions they might ask.

A whole mix of emotions was experienced, and children had the chance to choose emoji stickers to describe how they felt. The children shared how they were angry, sad, confused and happy as they heard the different parts of the story.

The questions children wanted to ask were insightful. I wonder if you have ever asked these questions – the children did!

Why do people hate Jesus?

Why were the religious leaders jealous?

Why can't the people stop being horrible?

Judas, why did you betray your friend?

How could his friends fall asleep?

Why did the Soldiers arrest Jesus when he had done nothing wrong?

Some children wanted to encourage Jesus, and wrote words like:

I won't leave you.

I'm sorry this happened to you.

Are you ok?

Be strong.

And then when we learnt about Jesus rising from the dead, our thoughts turned to thanks and some of the children shared the following messages for Jesus.

You really are God's Son.

You are the best.

Thank you for dying for us.

As the children experienced the Movie Set, they created their own box of items, from a key ring, a pocket hug, to a bookmark to help remind them of the story – and to help them tell others what they had learnt. Which is what happened later in the week when Kingfisher led the Easter Service and retold the story of Easter to the rest of the school and parents who had come to watch.

ALTERKNIT UNIVERSE

Everyone in Cleeve must have noticed the knitting shop on the main road – it's been there for nearly 12 years. But how many people know the back story to this colourful shop?

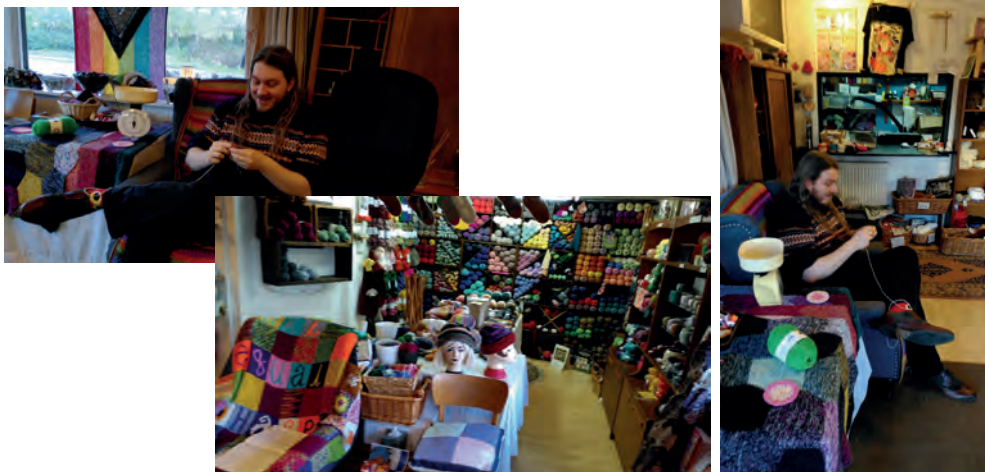
Years ago, the building was Pearce's butcher shop with a small slaughter house in the back yard but that has long gone. Then for many years it was a picture framing shop until Kim Smith gave it a new life.

Kim came originally from California but lived in Yatton from the age of 14 and went to Backwell school. She studied graphic design at university in London but suffered at that time from chronic fatigue syndrome. She took up knitting to help with this condition and eventually wanted to leave London and come back to her roots around here. She saw the shop for sale and the house next door and, along with her parents, Martin and Bev Smith they bought them. Kim used money from the sale of her London flat to set up the business which opened its doors in 2014. The three of them worked in the business and, following a difficult Covid period, Kim's partner Karl Dixon left his IT job and joined the business allowing Martin and Bev to almost retire – they still help out occasionally.

Tragically in 2024 Kim died but Karl has continued with the business, living above the shop. He has maintained the ethos established by Kim with a focus on fostering creativity and on selling products that are local, ethical, natural or recycled. Alongside the sale of yarn and related products, the shop is a venue for a free-of-charge knitting circle open to anyone and running each Sunday. There are sometimes 15 people of all ages gathered in the cosy setting of the shop, some coming from maybe 30 miles away. Knitting has been growing in popularity, especially crochet, with a recent boost linked to the Game of Wool television programme.

On top of all this, Karl provides space behind the shop for selling second-hand craft items, often donated as people de-clutter. The main business though is yarn and Karl enjoys working with local suppliers including backyard dyers. There is a wonderful range from which to choose. Pop in and see for yourself!

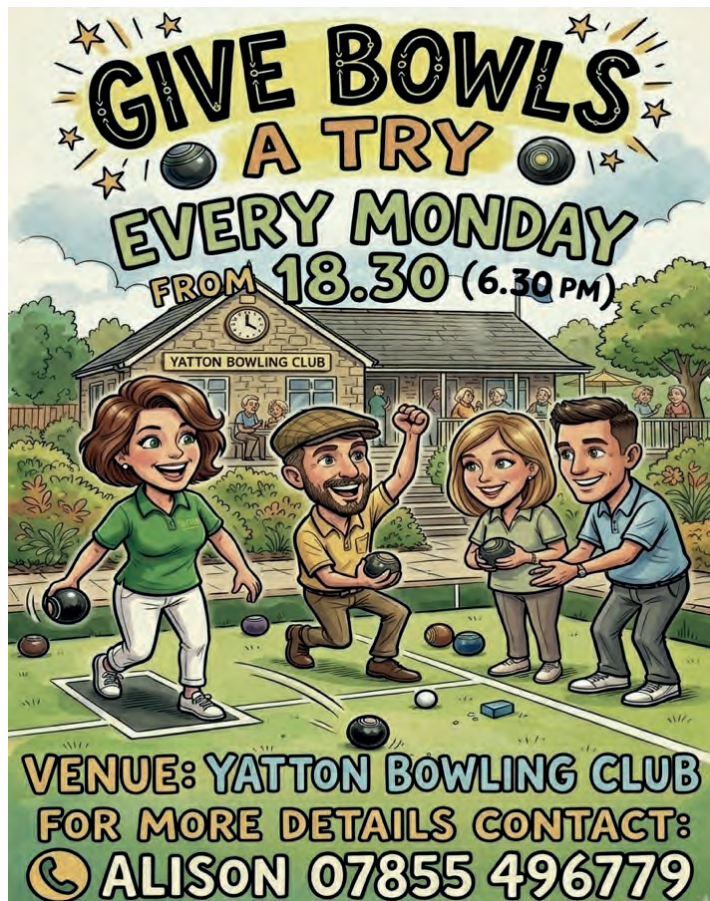
GO ON AND GIVE BOWLS A TRY AT YATTON BOWLING CLUB.

JAM SURPRISE CAKES

W.I. RECIPE From All About Cleeve – May 1995

Ingredients: (Serves at least 12)

4 oz Self Raising Flour
4 oz Soft Margarine
3-4 oz Castor Sugar
2-3 Eggs (depending upon size)

Method:

Mix all ingredients together.

Place a good teaspoon of mix into paper baking cases.

Make an indentation to take the jam.

Place a teaspoon of the jam of your choice into the indentation and completely cover with mix.

Smooth slightly.

Place near the top of the oven 400°F for about 10-15 mins until lightly golden.

Please note a firm jam is better as this will avoid the mixture and jam running.

GARDENING TIPS

Time to plant up your hanging baskets and containers.

Give some of your border perennials the "Chelsea Chop". If you cut some of them back by about half now it will delay flowering but extend the display longer in your garden.

Harden-off annual bedding plants ready to plant out soon. Put them in a shady spot, keep well watered but bring them back inside if frost is likely. Keep a close eye on them and they will be toughened up ready to plant after about a week.

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A WOMEN'S INSTITUTE AT WAR ... PART II

From an entry in AAC in February 1995

It seems to have been customary for members to obtain cheap sugar for jam direct from Headquarters. With the outbreak of war, a scheme was brought in to allow this to be fairly distributed, and to allow members who did not grow fruit to apply for sugar and use it for fruit obtained from other sources.

In June 1940 2½ cwt of sugar was allocated to Cleeve. The sugar came in 7 lb containers, and any member who bought one must bring back in September 12 lbs well-made jam or jelly for sale at a Government fixed price, (members could buy their own jam back if they wished). A Government inspector was likely to "swoop down to inspect the jam" - On one occasion she did and gave a good report on Cleeve's jam.

By the spring of 1941 a Fruit Preservation Centre was set up, the kitchen at the Village Hall and several large houses in the village being used to make jam and bottle fruit. In spite of frustrations such as the price of Gooseberries being changed three times in four days, the centre produced 715 lbs of jam by the end of the year. This must be where the reputation for W.I. jams was founded.

A group of members organised fortnightly dances for the American Servicemen who were camped at Brockley, members were also asked to invite them to their homes. Sometime later the dances were stopped because of the trouble with coloured troops, even though the view was expressed "They are in this country to help us win the war".

In the autumn of 1941 clothes were evidently beginning to get short because a "clothes clinic" was set up, meeting on Friday afternoons at members houses. The secretary asked all members to try and find odd pieces of material, old bits of wool or any garment they didn't need which could be cut up. No clothes were too old to bring as long as they were clean. This scheme started with enthusiasm, a display of remade clothes was displayed at the November meeting. However, after that the attendance was only moderate. The following June the clinic was closed, to be reopened in the autumn with a new name "The make do and mend working party", the word clinic was dropped because it suggested "decay and disease". The attendance was still only moderate but the meetings continued for some years and seem to have been useful and appreciated. Throughout the war years the W.I. meetings continued with much the same programme of events as today, which must have been a useful source of friendship and encouragement for the women of Cleeve.

Treasurer note – my own mother can remember picking blackberries and helping to make Jam for the WI, during the war while staying with her aunt, Kate Leman, at Bickley.

MEMORIES OF A CHILDHOOD IN CLEEVE

This photo is of my Mum, Mrs Doris Bennett and my two older sisters, taken at a gymkhana at Cleeve, in 1954. Mum and Dad (Bert Bennett) lived at the Cleeve Court Farm, Cleeve, from when they got married in 1948, until they moved to Claverham in April 1984. Dad was the estate manager for Lord and Lady Sinclair, who lived at Cleeve Court. The job came with a tied cottage and next door to us lived the chauffeur.

It was a lovely place to grow up, we named all the cows that Dad milked by hand. Haymaking was always very busy, trying to get the hay bales in before the weather changed with the help of Edgar Berry and his baling machine as Dad didn't have one.

Mum belonged to the WI at Cleeve and loved baking. No one ever left our house hungry if they paid our parents a visit. Also normally going home with half a dozen fresh eggs.

My sister, Hazel, can remember roller skating with her friend, Helen Morse, in the indoor squash court that belonged to Lord and Lady Sinclair, (not usually permitted). There was one time, when Lady Sinclair caught them. A stern look was enough to send them scurrying back home!
