The two sessions free also apply to the adults on Wednesday eve 7.00 start and Sundays at 2.00, come along and give it a go



#### **HELLO EVERYONE!**

Yes it's me again! This time last year I was a hub for the humanitarian aid charity "Hope for Ukraine". Lots of you will remember the front verge of No 32 Bishops Road being awash with your generosity for many months but sadly Liz suffered a stroke and Terry had to curtail his hub pickups to care for her.

I'm now acting as liaison between donees and the Humanitarian Aid Charity for Ukraine operating out of Nailsea. They work closely with many groups, MEDICINES and MEDICAL SUPPLIES going as far as Kharkiv and up to the front. Also to Zolochiv, 40 miles east of Lviv where they have trustworthy contacts in the military and hospitals and to a warehouse in Sucaeva NE Romania where it is mainly TOOLS and CLOTHING....where the Ukrainians go across to collect what they need.

The items they so desperately need are prioritized as below:

**MEDICAL**...catheter bags, stoma bags, dressings, bandages, pads, medicines, protein drinks, mobility aids, zimmers, adult incontinence pads, nappies 60cm x 90cm **BATTERIES** AAA - LR03, AA- LR 6, torches, candles, battery or rechargeable handheld lights, solar powered lanterns,

TOOLS, electric and hand....no rust please

**CAMPING EQUIPMENT** ...plus good condition small roll up inflatable mattresses **KITCHEN UTENSILS**, pots and pans etc.

CHILDREN'S CLOTHES...from prem baby to 5 years old.

CLOTHES..thermal underwear men and women

**GENERATORS.**.up to 4kWt, Power Banks...battery capacity from 20,000(mAh) **PORTABLE CHARGING STATIONS** ..Bluetti, Ecoflow 1600 W/h



For those who don't know what a Doppler is, it's a non-invasive test to detect blood flow/pressure to diagnose or help manage conditions such as peripheral arterial disease or a diabetic foot ulcer. If you have a concern or have a family member or friend with such issues who would benefit from a visit to our drop-in clinic, please don't hesitate to come. There are volunteer drivers available for those without transport, but they must be able to walk from their front door unaided to a car.

Added to the above there are wonderful refreshments on offer, tea/coffee and plenty of cake, and lots of chat too. Occasionally we get to 'party', recently for Easter, when the bonnets came out and chocolate and hot cross buns were enjoyed.

Our Chair of the Parish Council is Ronnie Morley. Your other Councillors are Hilary Burn, Marianne Pitman, George Stringer, Geoff Pritchard and Colin Knowles.

We are sorry to report that our Vice Chair, Ben Whistance, has tendered his resignation as he will be moving away from the area.

We wish to thank Ben for all his work on our behalf. He has been the guardian of the defibrillator, he worked out Cleeve's Carbon Footprint and was heavily involved in achieving the speed reduction on Cleeve Hill Road. Also contributed to the improvements at the quarry and its car park and also clearing the former Millennium Garden in readiness for its transformation into a Community Orchard.

With Ben's departure we will have a vacancy for a councillor and official notices will be posted on our noticeboards, website and via Facebook.

Being a Councillor is so much more than sitting around a table discussing planning applications. Being a Councillor means you help represent <u>your village</u>, a place you have chosen to live, a place you want to succeed and a place you want to continue being happy in.

We need some new ideas and fresh faces to take Cleeve forward in the right direction. The Parish Council meets once a month on the 2nd Tuesday from 7.30pm, the meetings are relaxed and welcoming, and most decisions are made during the meeting so there is little for Councillors to follow up on.

**Bristol Airport Noise Insulation Grant**: The Noise Insulation Grant programme commenced for this year on from 1 April to 1 June (and then again on 1 July, if not all the funding has been allocated). The big difference this year is that grants are being allocated for night noise and do not have to be matched funded by the owner of the dwelling. All dwellings must be within the noise contours. **Police update**: Our local PCSOs advise that A number of burglaries are continuing across North Somerset, especially ones where the purpose appears to be to obtain keys to high value vehicles parked on drives. The general advice is ensure outside lights and CCTV are working if you have them, keep your vehicles keys hidden, especially overnight and ensure keyless entry systems are not accidentally activated i.e. keep the keys in a "Faraday pouch".

#### FARMING

For those who will listen, I have spoken about the weather a number of times over the last few months and the impact it is having on the farming calendar. It might seem as though I have been exaggerating saying the continual wet weather is stopping farmers sowing crops but it appears that hasn't been the case. Locally we had limited success sowing arable crops in the autumn and some of these have rotted because they have been stood in water for months on end. We were hoping the area we missed in the autumn sowing window would have been sown with spring arable crops instead. Unfortunately, many of these areas have remained too wet too late and we haven't been able to sow these crops. We now have a choice, leave the land fallow (don't plant a crop), sow grass and use the grass for feeding to livestock or sow maize. The maize can be used for feeding to livestock or for anaerobic digestion for producing energy. Whilst sowing grass and maize for feeding to livestock might seem a reasonable answer there is a limit to how much of either crop we need for our cattle. There is an argument we could grow it this summer and store it for the winter 2025 - 2026 rather than 2024 - 2025 but this is a huge cost tied up. With the unsown land we have we would have over £150,000 in stock for up to eighteen months. It's like buying the all the family food for winter 2025 - 2026 and keeping it in the cupboard. It's not a very practical solution. That's the farmer's side of the story. The other side is the potential impact it will have on the consumer. The media have picked up on the very small area of crops currently sown in the UK and some have suggested 2024 might be the first year since World War II there hasn't been a harvest. Whether that is the case or not remains to be seen but it is s sobering thought. Whatever happens, the Government needs to start taking note of how precarious our food security situation is.

Summer is showtime in the Countryside. Locally we have the North Somerset Show on the first May Bank Holiday followed by the Bath and West at the end of the month and the Mid Somerset in August. Each are a fantastic day out with lots of animals to look at, great attractions, main ring activities and ample opportunity for some retail therapy. Each promotes all that is good about British agriculture, they support the rural economy and provide a social event for many.

#### **PLANT OF THE MONTH - ROSEMARY**

Rosemary, formerly *Rosmarinus officinalis* now reclassified to its scientific name *Salvia rosmarinus*, has nectar-rich flowers that are a magnet for pollinators. It flowers twice per season, first in spring and then again in summer; all the more reason to add this fantastic shrubby perennial herb to your garden.

Rosemary is a low maintenance plant and once established virtually looks after itself. Position in full sun but resist feeding with fertiliser as rosemary thrives in poor, preferably slightly acidic, soil.

Originating from the Mediterranean, rosemary detests being water logged so ensure soil is well-draining and gritty but will happily grow in the ground or in pots. Enjoy stunning varieties such as 'Miss Jessopp's Upright', 'Majorca Pink' or white rosemary *Salvia rosmarinus* f. albiflorus. Just keep an eye out for rosemary beetle.

Like most herbs it benefits from being cut back, this rejuvenates plants and prevents them getting woody, keeping stems fresh and young; just be aware that rosemary flowers on second year growth so to have a shrub covered in blooms you will need to avoid hard pruning to get the maximum floral display.

As well as being perfect for pollinators, rosemary is great for the senses. Planted along a path, the scent will waft up as you brush alongside it. Run your hand through the stems to enjoy the aroma and of course it's evergreen leaves taste great in recipes - fresh or dried.

This aromatic herb has many medicinal properties. Rosemary makes a great herbal tea and is famed to improve concentration and memory. Apparently Greek scholars would wear a rosemary garland during their exams. It's poignant scent certainly does pack a punch! It was even tucked under pillows in medieval times to ward off nightmares as well being used as a remedy for toothache and fevers. As a symbol of remembrance, rosemary often featured at weddings and funerals.
