

CLEEVE WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

Cleeve Women's Institute was set up in 1937. February 18th was the formation meeting attended by 50 women. The county secretary attended and gave a talk on the aims and objectives of the WI movement. A committee was elected and my great aunt was appointed secretary. I have the minutes of the meetings between 1937-1939. At the start of every meeting the hymn 'Jerusalem' was sung and the meetings ended with 'God Save the King'.

Below is a sample of the half year programme in 1937 and a photo of the members in Circa 1939/1940. Perhaps some villagers recognise their grandmothers, great Aunts or even Great Grandmothers!

Meetings were to be held in the Village Hall, which had recently been built in the grounds of Cleeve Court. The land had been given by Lord Sinclair.



TIPS FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

Regularly remove side shoots from tomato plants [unless you have a bush variety] and gradually increase watering and ventilation as they grow bigger and the days get warmer. Support plants well and gradually remove the lower leaves as they turn brown

Some indoor plants that have outgrown their pots will benefit from being potted on into larger pots this month. Don't be afraid to knock plants out of their pots to take a look at how the roots are doing

Recycling and waste collections are changing in June 2025

Waste Collections and recycling

Changes to recycling and waste collections being introduced this summer by North Somerset Council (NSC)

For most households, black bin collections will switch from fortnightly to three-weekly in June 2025, and a wider range of recycling materials will be collected every week, including plastic bags and soft plastic wrapping.

The changes will make recycling easier and reduce waste, and include:

- · a new collection day for most households
- · switching to three-weekly black bin collections
- plastic bags and soft plastic wrapping will start being collected.

Red recycling bags have already started being delivered to households for use straightaway alongside their existing recycling boxes, and later this month (April) NSC will be launching the new free North Somerset Council app.

Please provide information including your name, address, date and time of incident, and relevant information.

They will investigate any unusual disturbance from aircraft arriving and departing Bristol Airport or flying in close proximity. All complaints are responded to and statistics are publicly reported to the Airport Consultative Committee and recorded within Bristol Airport's, Annual Monitoring Report.

Plant outdoor tomatoes, ridge cucumbers, courgettes and marrows. These can all be easily grown in large pots or grow bags on the patio.

Most herbs will benefit from being cut fairly hard now. The young shoot tips are generally the tastiest parts to use in cooking.

There is still time to make a sowing of perpetual spinach leaf beet. This is a really useful vegetable that can be harvested right through the winter

TIPS FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

Oxygenating weed in ponds may be getting out of hand now so thin it out but always try to leave at least a third of the water surface covered to provide shade and shelter for wildlife.

Plant water lilies and other water plants this month. Make sure that water margin and bog plants are getting enough water and add mulch to help.

Autumn planted winter hardy onions and shallots may be ready to harvest at the end of the month. Let the skins ripen thoroughly in the sun as they store better then.
