NAILSEA DISTRICT LEG CLUB

Leg Club opened the first Wednesday morning drop-in clinic almost 9 years ago, whatever the circumstance the drop-in clinic is for anyone registered with Tyntesfield Medical Group with concerns about lower leg problems, ulcers, varicose veins, pain, skin problems, rashes, etc. The clinic operates every Wednesday 9.00-11.30~a.m., at Nailsea Tithe Barn, Church Lane, Nailsea, BS48 4NG. The X9 bus goes close by and if necessary there are volunteer drivers on hand to provide a lift for those who do not have transport, providing they're able to walk from their front door to the car without assistance.

Nurses are employed either by Tyntesfield Medical Group or the Community Partnership and the NHS provides dressings used. We pay rent for the Tithe Barn, buy equipment and other incidentals such as refreshments, driver reimbursement and stationary, so rely on fundraising, plus member donations and grants.


COMMUNITY RESILIENCE

Council Meetings: Meetings are held in Cleeve Village Hall on the 2nd Tuesday of each month (except August and December when no meetings are held).

Details of meetings, agendas and minutes continue to be published on our website.





Our Chair of the Parish Council is Ronnie Morley. Your other Councillors are Hilary Burn, Marianne Pitman, George Stringer, Geoff Pritchard and Colin Knowles.

Being a Councillor is so much more than sitting around a table discussing planning applications Being a Councillor means you help represent your village, a place you have chosen to live, a place you want to succeed, and a place you want to continue being happy in.

We need some new ideas and fresh faces to take Cleeve forward in the right direction. The Parish Council meeting are relaxed and welcoming, and most decisions are made during the meetings so there is little for Councillors to follow up on

Potholes and damagae to Highways: There is, understandably, ongoing concern with potholes and the condition of roads in the Parish. Bishops Road, in particular, needs attention. Whilst we have lobbied North Somerset Council and will continue to do so it I always helpful if residents also submit reports via www.n-somerset.gov.uk Notice Board at Goblin Combe Car Park: You may have noticed that the notice board at Goblin Combe Car Park is currently covered up. This is whilst a check on accuracy is being carried out and we apologise for any inconvenience.

Bristol Airport Noise Insulation Grant: The Noise Insulation Grant programme commenced for this year from 1 April to 1 June (and than again from 1 July, if not all the funding has been allocated). The big difference this year is that grants are being allocated for night noise and do not have to be matched funded by the owner of the dwelling. All dwellings must be within the noise contours.

PLANT OF THE MONTH - NASTURTIUMS

A much-loved garden staple, nasturtiums are easy to grow from seed and virtually look after themselves once established. These vigorous plants are annuals but once you have introduced them to a spot it is likely they will come back every year as they readily self-seed.

Nasturtiums can be dwarf, *Tropaeolum minus* or climbers, *Tropaeolum majus*. Whether you need ground cover or want an obelisk dripping in foliage and flowers, nasturtium will oblige and pollinators will welcome their arrival.

Their foliage is particularly attractive to many butterfly caterpillars which makes them useful companion plants in a vegetable patch enticing wildlife to their leaves rather than your prized greens! They prefer well-drained, poor soil so refrain from piling on the fertiliser or you might not get many blooms as the leaves take over.


If you fancy something a little different try beautiful ornamental varieties like 'Orange Troika' or 'Alaska Series' both sport exquisite marbled leaves or go dotty for 'Ladybird Rose' or 'Ladybird Cream'.

Not only do nasturtiums look good but they taste good too; their brightly coloured flowers and leaves are incredible in salads, adding a peppery tang high in vitamin C and lutein, beneficial to eye health, whereas the seeds have acquired the fun name of 'poor man's caper'; pick them green and pickle them.

If you have left it a bit late to sow seed then pop in some plug plants and you will soon have a cascade of wonderful nasturtiums running through the garden until autumn frosts.

TIPS FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

Pick sweet peas regularly so that they are not allowed to set seed. As soon as seeds form the flowers will get smaller and there will be less produced. If you have too many, give them away to your neighbours!

If greenhouses are getting too hot, paint 'Coolglass' on the outside to reflect the sun's heat. This is easily wiped off in autumn. Wetting the floor regularly will also lower the temperature but don't do it late in the day.

Don't forget to keep plenty of water out for the birds to drink and to bathe in regularly. A shallow container out of reach of cats is best. Continue feeding the birds but if you feed peanuts make sure that the mesh prevents whole nuts being removed.

Mulch strawberry fruits as they develop. Straw is good if you can get it. Remove unwanted new runners or 'lay' some of them into the rows to root to form a continuous row.

If you want to raise your own border perennials then several really popular varieties should be sown now. Sow Delphinium, hollyhocks, lupins and foxgloves but keeping them cool will help germination at this time of year.


