CHAIR'S WELCOME

Welcome to June and another edition of All About Cleeve! Our future feels increasingly secure because, at their April meeting, the Parish Council confirmed a grant to AAC of £500 to help cover our costs. This is critically important for AAC and we are very grateful. This month we have a range of articles for you including the first part of the local WW2 Starfish story which will run over a number of months; more short articles on local businesses and users of the Village Hall; and an update on what's happening in Goblin Combe woods. As you may know, Bristol Airport has recently applied to expand from 12 to 15 million passengers a year having obtained, in 2022, permission to grow from 10 - 12 mppa. This will have an impact on Cleeve residents in terms of traffic, car parking, noise and environmental degradation. They plan to start major works in 2029. The Parish Council is submitting a detailed objection and everyone is encouraged to voice their own opinion (for or against) direct to North Somerset via the website <https://n-somerset.gov.uk/my-services> and follow links to Planning. The application number is 26/P/0686/OU2.

GARDENING TIPS

Ventilate your greenhouse on a regular basis. If it is still too hot inside, keep the doors open too.

It is usually at this time of year that whitefly and red spider mite populations in the greenhouse explode so, before that happens; order some natural predators via us to control these difficult pests the natural way.

Many indoor plants will benefit from the summer outside! Make sure that they are put in a shady spot and watered well.

Make sure newly planted fruit canes and bushes are always well watered.

Council Meetings

Meetings are held in Cleeve Village Hall on the 2nd Tuesday of each month (except August and December when no meetings are held).

Our Chair of the Parish Council is Ronnie Morley, your other Councillors being Colin Knowles (Vice Chair), Hilary Burn, Marianne Pitman, Carol Molloy and Simon Chambers.

Village Hall Defibrillator: Our new defibrillator is now installed, and operational, at the Village Hall.

Bristol Airport: The Bristol Airport Expansion Application (Reference number 26/P/0686/OU2) is now live and open for comments.

Follow this link <https://planning.n-somerset.gov.uk/online-applications/> click the "Search for a Planning Application" button enter the reference number 26/P/0686/OU2 in the "Simple Search" box.

The deadline for submissions to NSC is 28 June and it is very important that as many people as possible register their objections.

Main Points

There will be an approximate doubling of traffic on the A38 causing congestion and a spillover of airport traffic on to rural lanes and the A370

There will be an increase in annual day flights to 99,931 - just under 100,000

Night flights will increase from 4,000 to 4,974

An increase in ground and air noise

Code E aircraft are being brought in for long-haul flights. These flights are wide bodied large aircraft and noisier than code C narrow bodied airliners

There will be arrival landing lights on Felton Common, a public space. There will be more lighting on the Western and Eastern Aprons and the new car parks

There will be many more aircraft stands increasing from 38 to more than 50

The Western Apron is to house 38 aircraft. This apron is to be raised approximately 25 m. Lighting and ground noise will be received from it.

There is no new multi-storey car park in this application.

Car parking for 4,600 cars is required and it will be on green belt land.

Aviation Emissions will rise.

The Airport is extending its boundaries.

Local issues: There will be more car parking in Cleeve Village from passengers parking and taking the bus to the Airport

The bats roost is in Kingswood, the bats will be heavily affected as more land is taken for car parking from where they forage

Biodiversity will decline

Air and Noise will both increase

The landscape in our surrounding area is being changed and the lighting from the airport will become noticeable.

WOODLANDS ALIVE

In the last edition I introduced you to Goblin Combe Lodge site, where we welcome day and residential visitors at our eco lodge, communal cottage and camping field. This time, I'd like to offer you a snapshot into how we look after the wider Goblin Combe woodland and paths that Groundwork manage for the benefit and enjoyment of you, the local community, and its many other visitors.

It's a joy and a privilege to watch the woodlands in Goblin Combe come alive and burst into activity during Spring with bluebells, primroses, cuckoo flowers, wild garlic and wood anemones amongst many others greeting visitors along the footpaths. A little team of ecologists and trainees regularly visit these woods to undertake monitoring surveys of some of the wildlife here, specifically the endangered and protected hazel dormouse. Numbers have been falling across the country and indeed in Goblin Combe over the last few years, so it was very exciting and heartening (not to mention exceptionally cute), to see these dormice nesting in our woodlands again on the first survey of the season in April. We have plans in place to improve the habitats for these and our other wild residents in the next few years with a schedule of coppicing and complimentary woodland management to enhance and improve the natural environment.

You may have seen us out and about in the woodland in the new (to us!) vehicle in recent months with teams of volunteers, clearing back some of the overhanging and encroaching vegetation from the paths and removing old tree guards and litter. For the larger trees and branches that come down over the main paths, we bring in our trusty team of tree surgeon contractors who make the area safe. You may also see them removing some of the ash trees that have suffered in the recent ash die back outbreak, as we undertake a rolling programme of works to manage these. We are grateful to also have local residents who helpfully let us know when a large tree or branch has come down overnight and is blocking the main path - if you're regularly in the woods and come across one of these, please do send me a WhatsApp or email on the contact details below with a picture and location and help us keep the paths safe and accessible for all.

We're due to be in the woods on our next volunteer day on Monday 15th June with woodland steps to maintain and paths to clear. If you or someone you know would enjoy getting out in the woodland and lending a hand, why not get in touch and join us? Drop me an email or a message and I'll let you know all the details.

CLEEVE AND CLAVERHAM TABLE TENNIS CLUB

The table tennis club has been active for years. Mike Withyman joined in around 1970, became secretary to the club in the early 1980s and still performs this role, although no longer an active player. The club met at the St Barnabas church hall in Claverham, a rather cold and basic wooden structure, before moving to Cleeve Village Hall in around 1980 making them a very long-term user of the Hall.

The club is in good health, meeting each Tuesday at 7.30pm from September to April. They field four teams (each with three players) in the Bristol League and possibly five teams next season. The Bristol League has seven divisions with around 13 teams in each division. 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OPERATION STARFISH - Part 1

Ross Floyd has kindly submitted some fascinating information on Operation Starfish during the Second World War. He has split the article into 9 parts and we will be including these in All About Cleeve over the next 12 months as and when we have room.

DECOY FIRES LIT ON WRINGTON HILL.

These few words from the log of the local Cleeve air raid warden on 16th March 1941 give no hint of the frantic activity that took place on the hills above our village in the early part of the Second World War. Hidden from view and beyond top secret was a 'StarFish' bombing decoy intended to divert German Bombers from dropping their high explosive and incendiary bombs on Bristol and the surrounding infrastructure.

The need for passive air defence.

During the early stages of the war the British Isles were virtually defenceless against night time German bombing raids. Later as electronics developed, the defences became murderously effective, but true to form, in the 1930's the Government had completely neglected to make provision against night time bombing and when the Blitz began, there was no effective defence. Although a great deal of propaganda was generated about anti aircraft guns and barrage balloons, the truth was that they were archaic and useless against night time high level bombing while some guns still relied on sound location which was, and always had been, unworkable. A bomber had to be very unlucky to be hit by 'ack-ack' which was generally fired to boost civilian morale rather than with any serious hope of hitting an aircraft. Early night time German losses were negligible.

As defences developed night fighters were introduced. Single seat fighters were useless as the pilot spent his time flying rather than searching the sky. At first Blenheim light bombers fitted with gun packs under the fuselage were pressed into service as they had a navigator and another crew member to assist. Later on Defiant turret fighters that were hopeless in daylight were very effective at night in their designed role as bomber destroyers and towards the end of the Blitz, Beaufighters became available. These were twin engine heavy fighters similar in concept to the Messerschmitt Bf 110 and absolutely lethal. Armed with a pack of machine guns and cannon in the nose, and a navigator/loader/radar operator who also operated a rear defence machine gun they could shred a bomber with a single burst of fire.

However in 1940 there was little chance of intercepting German aircraft in the dark as fighters needed to be guided onto a target. This was impossible unless the night was clear with a full moon and in the early period of the Blitz, the Germans had a free run. Once British pilots could find the enemy they stood a chance of shooting them down but the number of successful interceptions were minimal and victories insignificant given the number of aircraft available to the Germans. More raiders were lost to navigational and pilot error or mechanical failure than they were to British defences. By the time the British had sorted themselves out, the Blitz was over, the German bomber fleets were operating on the Eastern Front and never seriously troubled Britain again although there were a number of highly damaging nuisance raids.

When the first ground control radar was introduced it appeared to be the solution as British fighters could be vectored onto German bombers. This was perfectly acceptable in daylight and good visibility but at night the last half mile still had to be done visually and most intercepts failed. The key was to put radar into the fighter so that guidance was available for the critical portion of an interception. Even when the equipment became available in the winter of 1940/41 when London, Bristol and other cities were being raided nightly, British radar sets were few and highly unreliable.

The equipment was hand built by 'boffins' and while they worked on the ground, by the time they were in the air and the primitive electronics had been subject to the vibration of engines and possibly gun recoil, they regularly failed, and more importantly, there were just too few to make any impact. However as they were improved, airborne radar made such a difference to the interception rate that a cover story was invented about night fighter pilots eating carrots to improve night time visibility, and this still persists today. However until the defences became effective there was a desperate need to find an alternative way to stop the rain of high explosive and fire bombs. That had to be passive defence.

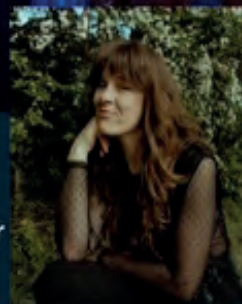
