W.I. RECIPE.

Kindly supplied by Christine Thomas.

Patience Pudding. (To make the previous day.)

Ingredients

½ lb black grapes
½ lb green grapes
½lb digestive biscuits
½ pint double cream
4 pint single cream
6 ozs demerara sugar
shallow heat-proof dish 2½ pints

Method

Halve and pip grapes. Keep black and green grapes separate. Crush the biscuits in a polythene bag. Cover the base of the dish with half the biscuit crumbs and scatter black grapes over. Whip the creams until thick and fluffy. Spread half over the grapes. Repeat the layers using green grapes, finishing with cream.

Sprinkle the top of the pudding with sugar and leave in the fridge overnight. On the following day caramelise the top of pudding under a hot grill so it browns evenly. The top will stay crisp until used.

Bristol Airport: The Bristol Airport Expansion Application (Reference number 26/P/0686/OU2) is now live and open for comments.

The deadline for submissions to NSC is 28 June and it is very important that as many people as possible register their objections.

CPC Chairman's Report 2025/26 (Delivered at Annual Parish Meeting 28 April 2026)

Highlights of the Past Year:

Your Council: We welcomed Cllrs Carol Molloy (May '25) and Simon Chambers (Oct '25).

A new Parish Council website and Councillor email addresses have been introduced in line with Assertion 10 guidelines. We also adopted 12 new policies, including those on fly posting and informal memorials.

The PC has responded to several NSC consultations, most recently the consultation on becoming part of WECA (West of England Combined Authority)

Traffic: In September, a new VAS (vehicle activated sign) was installed on Bishops Road using CIL (community infrastructure levy) funding and a Bristol Airport grant. Following frustrating discussions with NSC and the BSIP (bus service improvement plan) team, a 30mph speed limit has been secured for the village centre. Planned improvements include changes to the Weston-bound bus stop at Warners Close, improved drainage alongside Pound Green, and a new crossing point with extended double yellow lines on Bishops Road to improve safety exiting Millier Road & approaching the A370 junction.

Finance: In January, the precept was increased by 10%

The total precept was set at £19,249, equating to £51.04 per year for a Band D property.

This is the second consecutive increase, reflecting additional financial responsibilities due to NSC's Delivering Together programme.

Planning

- CPC responded to 16 planning applications, including:
- 2 new houses (including the 9 dwellings on the garden centre site)
- 7 extensions/refurbishments
- 1 outbuildings
- 6 other applications (e.g. advertising, retrospective)

We objected to the garden centre site planning application due to concerns over the potential for flooding, scale of the properties and access safety for pedestrians & vehicles.

Airport: In January, Cllr Burn and Clerk Andy Warren attended an airport parking summit focused on its impact on Cleeve.

Thanks to Hilary for her continued work on airport matters, particularly at moment the 15mppa application and the Save Felton Common campaign.

Community: Grants awarded this year:

- All About Cleeve: £500
- Yatton United Charities: £100
- Great Western Air Ambulance: £100
- Avon & Somerset Search & Rescue: £300

Thanks to Cllr Molloy and her husband Steve for transforming the Pound Green phone box into a book exchange. Please help support and look after this resource. Following withdrawal of NSC support for community resilience groups, the PC is reviewing how to continue supporting this valuable network. We are currently reviewing their policies & risk assessments so everything aligns with our Assertion 10 guidelines.

Open Spaces: In September, we hosted a well-attended presentation by the Forest of Avon on the Western Forest scheme and access to free trees.

The Future: Visual BSIP plans will be shared publicly once available.

We remain committed to improving road safety and are exploring further measures to reduce vehicle speeds throughout Cleeve.

Thanks: Thank you to all councillors and our clerk for their continued work supporting the community.

PIGS AT CHURCH FARM

The Haworth family arrived at Church Farm, Cleeve in around 1953 and started growing blackcurrants for Ribena, and apples. The next generation, Chris and Jenny Haworth, made a change and established a milking herd of Jersey cows.

Their daughter, Bridget, and her husband Chris White made further changes and started a beef suckler herd and, a while later, started to breed pigs eventually focusing solely on pigs.

They moved into pigs just as lots of people were pulling away from them. They bred weaners that went to Rex Baker to grow on for Bakers of Nailsea.

In 2001 Foot & Mouth hit the UK; farms were locked down at different levels. Weaners fast became big Porkers! So, Chris and Bridget began selling halves and whole pigs locally and at Claverham market. With help from Mike Amos, a successful Foot & Mouth Grant was made enabling them to bring their cutting and processing production in-house.

They now have fully equipped spaces for raw and cooked meat. They work closely with the Environmental Health Officer to ensure they maintain good practice when producing food products for the public and to maintain a 5-star rating, of which they are justly proud.

The herd is made up of Saddleback Pedigree and Saddleback Cross sows and BORIS their Pietrain Pedigree Boar.

As much as humanly possible the pigs farrow outside. The young stock then live with the herd, exploring and foraging across the ground. When they are nearing medium porker stage they bring them into sheds and yard space to finish them, ready for meat. The pigs love turnips and are just returning to the Church ground field as you can see in the picture.

Pigs are great characters and fun to watch. They are also big, heavy animals with a good mouthful of teeth. So, care is needed particularly when they are farrowing. You don't need to get involved, though, as all normally goes well.



The White's pigs are slow growing and take longer than a commercial pig to be ready for meat. They travel less than 3 miles to the local slaughterhouse. This means your food miles are minuscule and there is no stress to the pigs from travelling.

Chris and Bridget aim to supply customers in the local community; through farmers markets and direct sales. They encourage customers to shop and source food locally to reduce environmental impacts.

Theirs is a small family farm and they all have other jobs and businesses to support their incomes. But the family gene is strong; Jack and Hayley are the 4th generation with their beef suckler herd and sheep.

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STARFISH PART 2

'Colonel Turner's Department'.

Diversion, deception and bluff have always been a military tactic but it had never been used as a method of air defence. If the Germans could not be stopped, perhaps they could be led astray with passive defences. This became an absolute priority as unloading hundreds of tons of bombs every night onto defenceless cities resulted in catastrophic damage to war production, civilians and to morale.

The first defence was to find and then jam the radio direction beams that had been set up on the French coast to guide bombers to their targets. Now based in France and the Low Countries rather than in Germany the systems gave incredible accuracy using the Lorenz system of overlapping radio signals that produced a steady tone when the bomber was on track and another signal at the point of bomb release. Once located, using aircraft with special radio receivers, eavesdropping on German signals and code breaking, various electronic methods were used to jam the transmissions and add various spurious signals to create confusion and even chaos. This 'beam bending' as it was called was cutting edge technology at the time and was a mixture of intelligence gathering, electronics and guess work. It worked well for blind bombing in bad weather but on a clear moonlit night there was no defence as the main British cities were clearly visible and despite the blackout, easy to find. This was especially so for Bristol and London with a clear coast and large river pointing to the heart of the city. Electronic countermeasures often involved some inspired guesswork to fill the gaps in intelligence and when this failed the result was the disaster that befell Coventry.

On most nights, Britain had a fair amount of cloud and if the radio navigational aids could be interfered with, then Germans would need to rely on traditional visual methods of finding their way and then bomb aiming. Rather like the last half mile to an airborne interception depending on radar, the run into the target needed visual aiming if the navigation system was being jammed. This is where bombing decoys came into use. Those last few miles running into the target could hold the key to confusing the enemy bomb aimers and navigators.

In cooperation with Sound City Film Studios who were superb at special effects and film props, and under the guidance of Col. John Turner a retired military engineer who had a pilot's licence and was asked to return to active service, a Department was set up to produce dummy targets. It was so secret that it was not even named and just known as 'Col. Turner's Department'.

Due to the urgency of the problem with the commencement of night time bombing raids, the RAF having effectively halted German daylight operations after the Battle of Britain, Turner was given a completely free hand with no restriction on his use of material and supplies and he reported directly to Churchill. He set about bringing together the best film set designers and engineers to plan and then create a large number of dummy targets that would look realistic from the air at night and hopefully draw bombers away from their genuine objective. These eventually included individual aircraft and tanks, buildings, airfields, harbours, factories, rail yards and even complete cities but initially they concentrated on creating something that looked like a burning town when seen from high above.

The decoy system as it became known was beyond top secret as the effectiveness depended entirely on it remaining unknown to the Germans. It was so important that orders and instructions could only be delivered in person and not by telephone in case it was compromised. Despite being one of the very few wartime leaders with almost no restrictions, Turner used his powers very wisely and created a complete but almost unknown deception at minimal cost and careful use of resources. Unlike many other wartime commanders he remained focussed and power never went to his head.
