

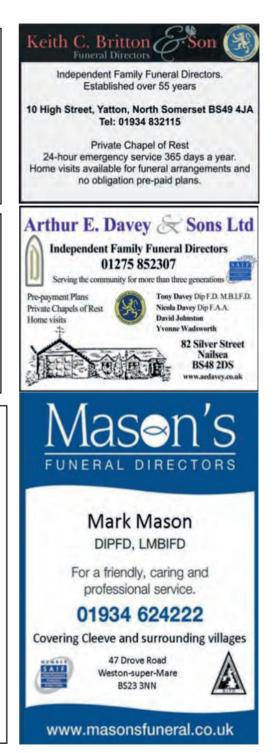

SWEET PEA CUT FLOWERS



TIPS FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

Cut back early flowering herbaceous perennials close to ground level unless they produce attractive seed heads. The seed heads and some dead stems and leaves can look enchanting with winter 'hoar' frost on them.

Put house plants that like humid air -ferns, bromeliad, insectivorous plants, etc. – on a saucer filled with damp pebbles. Begin misting over the leaves of your plants- especially when your central heating comes back on.

Lift and store potatoes. They need a frost free, dark cool place.

SWEET PEAS, LATHYRUS ODORATUS MEANING FRAGRANT PEA

It is hard to resist sweet peas; these whimsical flowers epitomise English summers with their divine colour palette from traditional pastels to vibrant bright hues to their ethereal heady scent but sometimes they can prove difficult to grow.

Former Cleeve resident Roger Harvey is following in his late father's footsteps with a natural flair for growing exceptional sweet peas. Each year he uses the cordon method to grow 'Spencer' blooms with huge flower heads held on very long, poker straight stems which seem to defy gravity.

His father, Leslie Russell Harvey, was a committee member for The National Sweet Pea Society, a flower show judge and won many prizes himself at national shows. He travelled the country giving talks and exhibiting, sharing his knowledge on the art of growing sweet peas; there is even a flower show cup named in his honour: the'Les Harvey Cup'.

So I asked Roger what are his three top tips for sweet pea success.

1. 'Sow seeds no more than half an inch deep in the autumn, two seeds per pot in sterilised compost consisting of three parts loam, two parts peat-free potting compost and one part either course sand or perlite'.

2. 'Immediately the hair-pin like shoots appear through the soil remove to the cold frame'.

3. 'Plant out on the 1st March'.

Come autumn I am sure we will all be reaching for our seed packets and following Roger's advice. There is nothing more satisfying than growing your own.

NORTH SOMERSET RECYCLING CHANGES

Changes are coming to North Somerset recycling and waste collections next year which will:

help everyone recycle more and waste less

cut the cost of waste disposal for council taxpayers

provide additional support to households who are least able to manage their waste.

The changes will be introduced in phases in 2025 and include:

the introduction of a kerbside collection of soft plastics (such as crisp packets and vegetable packaging)

switching from a fortnightly to a three-weekly collection of non-recyclable (black bin) rubbish.

A new recycling container will be trialled at some properties over the coming months, and training for collection crews will be refreshed.

Anyone who may struggle with a change to bin collection frequency due to medical needs, children in nappies or a larger household will receive additional support and a slightly different solution could be put in place for that household.

We'll share more information about this support as soon as the details are available. There'll be lots more information about what's going to be changing in the coming months, before any changes are made.

Several other councils have already successfully made the switch to threeweekly non-recyclable rubbish collections including Somerset, East Devon, and Mid-Devon.

Unfortunately, these changes don't mean we can reduce or refund your council tax. Like many councils across the country, we face significant financial challenges that are only getting worse. In the last decade, we've had to make tens of millions of pounds worth of savings and that means we've had to make some very difficult decisions.

As well as improving recycling rates and cutting waste, these changes will help us save an estimated £1.1m a year which will help fund other vital services.

This year, we'll need to spend around £5 million to dispose of black bin rubbish, but almost half of this waste could instead be recycled and generate an income to help pay for vital local services.

The frequency of other recycling and waste collections will stay the same, with weekly collections of food waste and recycling, plus there's also the optional, chargeable regular garden waste service.

September is the beginning of the traditional autumn planting season and is in fact the best time to plant hardy plants. The soil is moist and warm and plants soon get established now, so get out your spades and get planting!

Lift, divide and replant the youngest bits of herbaceous perennials that have finished flowering. Most perennials benefit from dividing every 2-3 years. Improve soil and water in well to get them re-established.
