### **UKRAINE**

Andy, who collects from Libby for Ukraine, has sent the following which we thought would be interesting for our readers:

In essence, what is collected mostly goes to Front Line areas; differing areas, so as to not saturate any one area eg the most recent lorry went to Zaporizizhia. In all cases, the collections go to a Hub, either organised by volunteers or the military. There the items are locally sorted and sent to where needed, the Hubs that have requested the current needs.

Presently, most goes by lorry to the Ukraine border and is then taken on from there.; The lorry also stays in Ukraine,: easier and cheaper than bringing it back!

What goes for either military or civilian use is on a "needs must basis", unless there is a specific destination, and that then is frequently reached using the Ukraine Postal Service (which is far more efficient than OUR Post Office and cheaper!). Who takes it out, decides on the route there, so could be either ferry or the Tunnel.

I deal directly with 5 people taking stuff out and dozens indirectly; all trusted people who report back on when something has arrived and particularly a specific item for a specific person. I deliberately don't ask for specific destinations for security reasons and I allow a month to pass, before spreading the word of items going out, for the same reason that I can't be sure who reads my posts!

Hope this covers the main points.

### **GARDENING TIPS FOR SEPTEMBER**

Check cuttings of Fuchsias, Pelargoniums and other tender perennials for roots. If well rooted, pot them on into 9cm [3.5"] pots filled with good potting compost. If not, leave the potting until spring. There is still time to root more.

Replant pots and hanging baskets with autumn, winter and spring flowering and foliage plants.

Take cuttings of Pelargoniums, Fuchsias and other tender plants.

Pot up prepared Hyacinths to get them in flower for Christmas. Get them potted this month unless you are happy to have them in flower in January.

Lift root crops such as carrots and beetroot and store them in a frost free place. Bury them in boxes filled with damp sand and keep them in a cool building such as the garage. Setting a mousetrap or two nearby might be a sensible precaution.

Volunteer drivers also needed to pick up within the Tyntsfield Medical Group area, mileage is paid and a willingness to go on a rota maybe twice a month. Those who are picked up have to be able to walk unaided from their front door to the car; some members bring 'walkers' with them, which fold for the car boot.

### **GARDENING TIPS FOR SEPTEMBER**

Erect a net over your pond to prevent falling leaves from trees and shrubs getting into the water and increasing the nutrient levels when they breakdown. They may also deprive the fish of oxygen as they decompose.

Clean out nesting boxes and give your bird table a good scrub before the main bird feeding season gets underway.

Start feeding birds again (if you ever stopped).

Provide log piles in odd corners to act as wildlife refuges.

Put up lacewing, bee and ladybird shelters to provide over wintering refuges for these very useful predators to stay in your garden.

Install a hedgehog, frog and toad shelter.

Goblin Combe We have been asked by Groundwork to add their "Woodland news". We were very sad and concerned that a campfire in our woods was attended by the fire service in July, and had to be put out for a second time a week later when the roots of the trees were still smouldering. Please consider how extremely dry the woodlands are at present and discourage others from bringing BBQs or setting fires in the woodland. Even when you think it's been completely extinguished, evidence shows us that fires can start up again days later.

In happier news, we now have a brand-new woodland management plan in place and can soon begin hazel coppicing and planting to encourage hazel dormice back to areas that have recently seen a decline. Watch this space!

All complaints are responded to and statistics are publicly reported to the Airport Consultative Committee and recorded within Bristol Airport's, Annual Monitoring Report.

# CLEEVE COMMUNITY GARDEN (bordering the Playing Fields at the end of Graitney Close).

Over the last year or two Parish Councillors and others have worked hard to clear the garden and have planted a selection of fruit trees. Everyone is encouraged to enjoy the garden and the fruit when it's ready to eat.



**GARDENING TIPS FOR SEPTEMBER** 

Make sure that any lavender plants, not pruned earlier, are done now. Cut off faded flowers with about 2-3 cm of leaf shoot but don't cut back into old woody growth. Create a cottage garden effect by sowing easy to grow hardy annuals. Calendula and Love-In-A-Mist [Nigella] look good together. Cornflower, Larkspur and Clarkia will give some height to the middle and back of a border and are good cut flowers too! All can be sown directly into well prepared soil where you want them to flower and don't need to be raised in trays and transplanted. They are hardy enough to over-winter without frost protection and will give a good show next summer!

Dry off Begonia corms. Cut back and pot up any tender perennials worth keeping in the greenhouse.

### **GARDENING TIPS FOR SEPTEMBER**

Pick ripe Apples and Pears now. If they come off the tree easily without having to tug hard, then they are ready to harvest. If you cut one or two in half, look for brown pips to show that they are ready. Varieties harvested now will not store well and should be eaten or cooked straight away.

Harvest marrows, squashes and pumpkins before first frosts. Store in a frost-free shed or garage. Cut them leaving an inch or two of stem attached.

Harvest sweet corn when the tassels are just going brown and the tops kernels produce milky sap when a thumbnail is pushed into them.

### **GARDENING TIPS FOR SEPTEMBER**

Sow fallow areas of your vegetable patch with quick growing 'green manure' crop. This will improve the soil structure and reduce nutrients being washed out of your soil by the winter rains. Choose from Winter Tares, Grazing Rye and Field Beans. Dig it all into the soil before they come into flower.

Remember to use bulb fibre rather than potting compost if the pots you use have no drainage holes. Make certain that the bulbs have made plenty of roots and that you can feel the flower bud in the shoot protruding out of the bulb before you bring them into warmth.
