CHAIR'S WELCOME


November's magazine has information a plenty on activities in the Village and surrounding areas. Many volunteers work hard especially to fund raise at this time of year, so please support these local events.

TIPS FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

Sweep up leaves and compost them add a compost accelerator to speed up the process.

Disconnect your hosepipe from the outside tap, store it and lag the tap to protect it from frost.

Open the ventilators in your greenhouse a little on mild days. This will encourage good air circulation and will minimise diseases.

TIP FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

Reduce water given to cacti and succulents in winter, they still need some and will also benefit from a weak feed every month or so. Christmas cacti [Zygocactus or Schlumbergia] need more regular watering otherwise they will drop their flower buds.

PLANT OF THE MONTH - MAHONIA

Mahonia, also known as Oregon Grape, is a hardy evergreen shrub that flowers from November to March. Clusters of long, vibrant, scented spires (racemes) of acid yellow blooms erupt above spiky-toothed large glossy foliage whose individual leaflets resemble holly. Mahonia's winter flowering produces an essential source of nectar and pollen for early emerging bumblebees.

After flowering mahonia produces attractive bunches of purple-blue berries which are not only loved by birds but can be cooked down to remove seeds and enjoyed as jam, jelly or cordial; rather too tart to eat raw!

There are around 70 species of mahonia so choose the right variety for your garden space and conditions.

Mahonia x media 'Charity' or 'Winter Sun' tolerate most soil conditions, sun and partial shade, with both shrubs eventually growing to around 4m tall and wide, making an impressive, architectural focal point in a border or try shade-loving Mahonia aquifolium and Mahonia japonica which will ultimately reach around 1-1.5m tall and spread to around 1.5-2.5m.

These shrubs are tough and can survive down to a chilly -15°C. They will offer all-year-round foliage which virtually looks after itself.

TIPS FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

Pinch immature figs off outdoor plants. These will not grow on if left but will rot on the tree so are best taken off now. Anything smaller than the size of a pea can be left to grow on and should survive the winter to ripen next summer. Where the fig is growing in a pot protect the tender roots from frost by wrapping the pot.
