
NAILSEA DISTRICT LEG CLUB

GARDENING TIPS FOR DECEMBER

Dead-head pansies, Violas and Cyclamen to encourage more flowers.

The autumn sown sweet peas should have the tips pinched out after the second pair of true leaves open.

Prune out old wood to rejuvenate shrubs. Wisteria pruning can be completed now along with vines.

CLAVERHAM FUTURE IS OUR CONCERN

Claverham Future is the action group established to gather evidence for opposing unsuitable new developments in Claverham. The group has been collecting evidence to oppose unsuitable developments, posting on the Claverham Future FaceBook page and building the list of email addresses for residents. We recognise these developments will have an impact on Cleeve in terms of road traffic, schools and other general infrastructure.

Planning applications are expected for High Street from Clarion/Latimer and Claverham Road from Wain Homes end November/early December. Each developer is proposing 130 homes. We are not disputing the need for additional houses, but we do not believe the land identified is suitable. There are access issues, insufficient pavement provision, pupil numbers at the local school will increase, the land is valuable farm land and hosts endangered species, and there are many more aspects.

Once the planning applications are in Claverham Future will need to act quickly and circulate evidence and sample letters to residents so they can form and submit their own objections. It is critical that every resident submits objections and that they are written independently. Anyone over 16 can submit objections but each objection should be tailored to appear individual. Planning officers are quick to pick up on copied objections and will ignore them. It is also very important that objections are not based on personal emotive subjects as sadly these carry no weight with planning officers. Objections must be based on fact and where possible carry evidence. This is where Claverham Future will help residents by supplying the evidence and helping with template letters.

You can help by submitting to Claverham Future evidence for objections – any experience you have had with traffic incidents, road safety, difficulty due to lack of amenities, damage to ecology, or flooding, etc.





GARDENING TIPS FOR DECEMBER

Mice and rats will move inside for warmth and shelter so check greenhouses and sheds and take precautions where you have seed, vegetables and bulbs stored.

Check that greenhouse heaters are working properly.

Prune apples and pears to improve their shape, encourage younger growth, remove disease and to control the amount of fruit bud they have. Don't prune fan, espalier and cordon trained trees as these should be summer pruned.

Plant up Amaryllis [Hippeastrum] bulbs inside. Use a soil based compost and water very sparingly to start with. As flowers and leaves appear, give more water.

Blackcurrants, if they were not done in the summer, can be pruned. Cut old wood to ground level.

HOMEMADE CHRISTMAS MINCEMEAT

Try this recipe for a tasty alternative to mass-produced mince pies. This makes about 2.75 kg

450g Bramley apples (cored, chopped, unpeeled)
225g shredded suet (can be vegetarian suet)
350g raisins
225g each of sultanas and of currants and of mixed candied peel
350g soft dark brown sugar
Grated zest and juice of 2 oranges and 2 lemons
50g whole almonds (in slivers)
4 teaspoons mixed ground spice
½ teaspoon ground cinnanmon
Grated nutmeg
6 tablespoons brandy

Combine the ingredients except for the brandy; stir and mix very thoroughly. Cover with a cloth and leave in a cool place overnight. Cover the bowl with foil and place in the oven at 120°C for 3 hours. Remove and, as it cools, stir occasionally. When cold add brandy and place in clean, sealed jars. Store in a cool dark cupboard. Make up into mince pies; eat, share and enjoy!
