#### **CLEEVE QUARRY CAR PARK SIGN**

I recently drove past the quarry at Cleeve, and was very surprised to see a brand new notice board in place.

Having looked at the notice board I found that it was advertising public and permissive footpaths in the Goblin Combe area, the Cleeve end of Goblin Combe is owned by a charity called Groundworks and the Wrington end by Avon Wildlife.

Knowing the area very well I found that there were a lot of inaccuracies on the map and not at all to scale, the boundaries of the charities' land wasn't defined, there are also routes marked in purple on private adjacent land which being private should be of no interest to anyone! Further to my amazement Cleeve Parish Council's Minutes informed me that the complete timber sign and map cost Cleeve Parish Council £2,670 plus erecting cost of £312.00. Is this good use of the rate payer's money?

#### TIPS FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

If your Hellebores have dark spots on the leaves [Hellebore Leaf Spot] cut the old leaves completely off at ground level to prevent the disease infecting the new leaves as they emerge. Move potted 'prepared' Hyacinths into warmer rooms to gradually force them into flower in time for Christmas. If they are coming on too fast move them back into the cool again.

Plant up Amaryllis [Hippeastrum] bulbs inside. Use a soil based compost and water very sparingly to start with. As flowers and leaves appear, give more water.



#### PLANT OF THE MONTH - DOGWOOD

I find the winter garden is full of wonder. It can be surprisingly floral, fragrant and a wash with colourful berries and shimmering grasses.

As many plants are leaning towards dormancy, others are getting into their stride. Radiant winter stems of cornus, dogwood, glow at this time of year.

*Cornus alba* Sibirica has deep mahogany-red stems which look particularly impressive planted en-mass. *Cornus stolonifera* Flaviramea is a picture of lime green stems whereas *Cornus sanguinea* 'Midwinter Fire' has the most breathtaking flame-like golden stems that melt to amber then scarlet.

Cornus provides all-year-round interest and is an attractive deciduous shrub with pretty flowers and fruits, known as drupes which are a hit with wildlife. They can grow in any soil type but favour moisture. They have a suckering habitat but this can be easily managed.

Over time older stems dull and loose their sheen. Every three years or so Cornus can be coppiced to the ground at the end of winter and new upright stems will grow back brightly with vigour. A less drastic action is to prune out the oldest stems and leave the newer ones so the shrub always has a cycle of old and new, leaving some foliage-bearing stems for the forthcoming year.

#### **CLEEVE PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE**

We would like to take the opportunity to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and Happy New Year for 2023.

**Council Meetings:** Meetings are held in Cleeve Village Hall on the 2nd Tuesday of each month (except August and December when no meetings are held).

Details of meetings, agendas and minutes continue to be published on our website. You can access our website at <u>www.cleeveparishcouncil.co.uk</u>

Our Chair of the Parish Council is Ronnie Morley with Ben Whistance being our Vice Chair.

Your other Councillors are Hilary Burn, Marianne Pitman, George Stringer and Geoff Pritchard.

**Traffic Strategy for Cleeve**: The Parish Council speed and travel survey has now closed with 131 responses. This gives a response rate of roughly 13%, which is what you would expect from an externally facing survey (12-15% average). For some context, the survey was completed predominantly by over 65's but closely followed by parents with children aged 16 and under. 6% of respondents said they had a disability, illness, or mobility difficulties. 66% of respondents were in full or part time employment.

Some qualitative data we received about difficulties residents faced were with speed or traffic. In particular, traffic on lanes being too fast and being used as cut-through roads and there is limited space to walk safely or cycle.

Respondents overwhelming felt that slowing down the traffic in Cleeve would be beneficial and indicated that they believed the speed limit should be 20mph throughout Cleeve, with the exception of the A370 (30mph), Meetinghouse Lane (30mph), Old Main Road (30mph) and top of Cleeve Hill Road to Woodview Kennels (30mph).

The three solutions that respondents felt most appropriate to mitigate against speed were: Village Gateway Scheme; Speed Tables; Vehicle Activated Signs

The full report of the data collected will be available to view on the Parish Council Website.

#### TIPS FROM CLEEVE NURSERY FOR JANUARY

Buy seed potatoes and set them up to shoot ['chitting']. Early varieties like 'Rocket' will benefit but later varieties will yield better too if encouraged into growth before planting out. If you have room for only one variety, grow 'Charlotte'.

Plant shallots. They prefer soil that hasn't been used to grow onions, leeks or shallots for several years before and a well manured plot. Delay planting onion sets until warmer.

Cover a piece of cultivated veg patch to trap the weak winter sun's warmth so that early sowings of carrots, parsnips, peas and other vegetables can be made. Use clear polythene and lay it flat on the soil but weight down the edges to stop it blowing away.

Apply bark mulch to areas between plants that are free of weeds and now fully moistened by winter rain. This will trap the moisture in and keep the weeds down in summer.

Mowing the lawn in winter has now become a feature of winter gardening. As long as the lawn is not very wet and the grass is not frozen there is no reason why you should not continue to mow. Don't have the blades set low. Brush worm casts off your lawns as they appear.

#### TIPS FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

Cut the side branches off your old Christmas tree and use these to cover tender plants in the garden. This will keep the worst of the frost off and yet allow the plant to breathe at the same time.

After frost, check around shrubs and roses for signs of soil upheaval and wind-rock. Firm the soil back down with your feet.

Established bulb shoots will be showing above ground now and are very tough so will not need protecting. Daffodils in pots outside will suffer if the pot is not protected from wind driven frosts so move them to more shelter.

Move potted strawberries inside to begin forcing them for really early crops. They should have experienced enough cold outside to break dormancy by now.


