

CLEEVE COMMUNITY 2050

Does someone need to die in a road accident before the Council changes the speed limit through Cleeve?

It's a fair question arising from our recent community meeting, and it is remains completely unclear to us what the process and timeline is for a decision, let alone any dates for North Somerset Council to make the long-overdue changes.

As a member of Cleeve's small community speed watch team, I spend a couple of hours a month with a radar, usually on the side of the A370. It is reassuring to see the vast majority of drivers taking care as they drive through our village (albeit a lot of them slowing down when they see us!). However, I regularly witness people driving carelessly and often some dangerous driving too. We record a driver's registration if they are going above 46mph and some people are doing more than 50mph as come past us - no doubt a contributory factor in the number of serious accidents at the junction with Bishops Rd.

People at our meeting also talked about the noise, particularly from modified exhausts, as well as inconsiderate parking. Indeed, the detailed knowledge of local residents could be a huge help in designing a safer Cleeve and with the help of the Parish Council we hope to put pressure on the system to do a better job of reacting positively to the local community's needs before anyone else gets hurt.

COMMUNITY RESILIENCE UPDATE

Four of our volunteers recently attended a table top exercise in Congresbury looking at the scenario of a major power outage. Albeit there were useful things to take away by those that attended we believe that any action necessary in the event of a disruption of this nature will be driven by our local Cleeve team with limited support from the local authority. To that end we would advise (even though the clocks have gone forward and spring is here!):

Having a wind up torch (no batteries required). Candles can be dangerous! There are loads on the market from around £10 upwards

Consider a portable radio (with spare batteries) as in the event of major disruption local radio can be a good source of information. Wind up radios are available as well! Keep your mobile fully charged

Consider downloading the power track app where you can report power outages and see where power cuts are in your area and when power will be restored. Here is the link: https://www.ssen.co.uk/news-views/2018/2018-power-track-app/ OR https://play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=com.sse.powertrack

We are in the fortunate position of having a central 'hub' namely the village hall, which would be our operational hub in the event of a prolonged outage

ON OUR FARMS - NICK GREEN

We have just experienced the wettest March in forty years. As well as being absolutely miserable for anyone wanting to do anything outside, it has been a nightmare for farmers. Wet fields mean no spring cultivations can be carried out and no cows can be 'turned out for grazing'. It also means, with waterlogged and cold soil, whatever crops are in the ground won't grow. Many will have seen the fields adjacent to the River Yeo when travelling up and down the A38. The barley in the field immediately adjacent to the main road has hardly grown over the last month and where there has been standing water the crop has died. Many farmers are still suffering from the drought last summer with a shortage of feed remaining in store so a wet, late winter is the last thing they want. But there we are, it's nature and I'm a great believer in the seasons cancelling themselves out so I'm hoping for a nice spring and summer. With the late, wet winter, spring field work is going to be crammed into a short space of time so don't be surprised if you see tractors working late at night and early in the morning.

We have an interesting situation developing in British farming. With the UK leaving the EU, the system of support payments is changing. The current system of paying farmers based on the amount of land they have is being replaced by a system rewarding farmers with public money in return for public goods. There is an argument that farmers shouldn't receive any money from the public purse and many farmers would agree. However, if UK farming isn't competitive with other countries in the world for whatever reason there needs to be some support. That said, there needs to be a discussion about what public goods might include. Should it be the obvious things like planting tress and hedges and public access or should it include food security? There are very few of us in the UK which have experienced a real food shortage. Government tells us it's nothing to worry about. We can afford to buy food from other countries. All well and good for now but will we always be able to afford it and will other countries want to sell it to us? Think about the conflict in Ukraine and the impact it had on us as consumers. As well as gas and oil, food prices rocketed. Think of the winter drought in Spain. Reduced salad crops through the winter and a tight supply in the spring. UK food security needs to be high everyone's agenda.

BACKWELL DISTRICT GIRLGUIDING

The launch of Girlguiding's new branding gives us the opportunity to showcase Girlguiding both locally and nationally. The symbol that brings us all together in Girlguiding is the trefoil, and it has changed too. The new design has been created to represent and retain our heritage, while being modern and easy to use.

Each part of the trefoil has a meaning.

- The three leaves represent a part of the promise:
- o Self: being true to myself and developing my beliefs
- o Others: serving the King and my community and helping other people
- o Keeping the Guide law
- The guiding star represents the Guide law.
- The 2 Gs represent Girlguiding and are a reference to earlier versions of our trefoil.
- The stem of the trefoil points forwards and towards the guiding star, showing the direction members are always going in.

Our new brand purpose is "We help all girls know they can do anything" – this and describes exactly what we do.

- **We help**: shows that we are a supportive organisation. Using 'we' highlights importance of togetherness and belonging.
- **All girls**: we are an inclusive organisation, and everything we do aims to bring the guiding experience to as many girls as we possibly can. It reinforces the community that powers Girlquiding.
- Know: this reflects the courage and confidence of what we offer to girls.
- They can do anything: 'do' is active and is about participation and the attitude of trying new things. Both the activities we offer week in week out, and also a mindset that they can take out into the world, a way of seeing that there are hundreds of possibilities waiting for them to get stuck into.

Here in Backwell District we operate three units – Rainbows and Brownies, which meet at the Scout and Guide HQ in Rodney Road, and Guides that meet in Cleeve Village Hall. This rolling programme enables our girls to enjoy all the benefits of Girlguiding from the age of 4 all the way through to 15.

Rainbows - Backwell Rainbows meet every month, on the first Sunday.

PLANT OF THE MONTH - OSTEOSPERMUM

Osteospermum or African Daisy is a long-flowering sun-loviong tender perennial which is often treated as an annual but if planteed in a protected location will flower for years. These low maintenance plants become covered in a carpet of bright, vibtant flowers ranging from deep purple through to burnt orange and white from late spring to late autumn; just feed and deadhead to keep them blooming and make sure the soil is free-draining an ideally slightly acidic.

These plants are sun worshippers and in fact open fully in the sun and close in dull weather and at night. Although established plants are fairly drought tolerant they do like to stay moist and benefit from a good water in dry periods. The plants will go dormant in heat waves and pause flowering but will continue to bloom once conditions are more favourable.

Osteoepermum are perfect for pots so if you feel like you need some portable colour, pot some up. This is an ideal way to ensure you inject some colour onto your patio, drive or entrance where you may not have borders.

If you want to grow some unusual osteospermum varieties try the 'Whirlygig' series. These architectural blooms have dark centres and spoon-shaped petals that are truly eye-catchging. 'Whirlygig' is susceptible to frost so overwinter in a greenhouse or take cuttings for the following year.




