

CLEEVE PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

Council Meetings: We have now returned to face to face meetings which will be held on the 2nd Tuesday of each month (except August and December when no meetings are held).

Our final meeting of 2021 will be held on Tuesday 9 November.

All meetings will be held in Cleeve Village Hall in accordance with any Covid-19 regulations current at that time.

Details of meetings, agendas and minutes continue to be published on our website.

CIL (Community Infrastructure Levy) Monies: The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) is a new way of collecting financial contributions from developments towards the provision of infrastructure required to support growth in North Somerset. It has been in place since January 2018 and North Somerset Council CIL charges are based on a tariff of rates that have been set through public consultation and examination by the Planning Inspectorate.

Town and Parish Councils in North Somerset will receive a proportion of the CIL funds collected from developments in their Town or Parish.

In Cleeve we have received a payment relating to the re-development of the former Lord Nelson site.

The CIL Regulations state that a Town/Parish Council must use CIL receipts passed to it in accordance with Regulation 59A or 59B to support the development of the local council's area, or any part of that area, by funding:

(a) the provision, improvement, replacement, operation or maintenance of infrastructure; or

(b) anything else that is concerned with addressing the demands that development places on an area.

Cleeve Parish Council are consulting the community on any ideas they may have for projects. The ideas must be

- a) For the benefit of the community.
- b) No major infrastructure projects.

c) Projects up to a value of £5,000.

We will also publish this request on our Facebook page and be available to discuss at parish "surgeries" when these re-commence. We will also review any issues which may arise once the new development is operational in Spring 2022.

Goblin Combe: Work continues to make improvements to the car park and also to provide new signage to help visitors and provide background to the natural history of the area.

Parking in and around Goblin Combe continues to cause issues with increased usage during the various lockdown periods. A number of options are being considered including use of hard core to improve the surface and use of low level posts and fence poles to create a formal "entrance" to the car park improving visibility for cars emerging from the car park. A similar fence could be installed opposite the car park to discourage parking on the verge.

Review of parking/speed restrictions in Cleeve: Following our request for suggestions of amendments to parking restrictions we have made submissions to North Somerset Council and have met with their senior engineer to review options.

We are very disappointed that the reduced speed limit on Cleeve Hill Road is still to be finally scheduled but we are keeping up pressure for the work to be completed as soon as possible. Our District Councillor, Steve Hogg, is actively involved in fighting for this on our behalf.

Alongside ongoing review of Cleeve Hill Road/ Goblin Combe parking issues we have also made representations regarding Millier Road.

The specific area in question is the corners of Millier Road and Woodview Drive by the dentists and the installation of double yellow lines is being proposed. We are grateful to Debs Lister for the information she has provided and to District Councillor Steve Hogg for adding his support.

There have also been issues with contractors for the Lord Nelson site development parking in Millier Road and this has been taken up on our behalf by our PCSO Julie.

20's Plenty North Somerset: At our July Parish Council meeting we welcomed Cresten Boase who gave us a presentation on this campaign.

20's Plenty North Somerset is a community led campaign to reduce the speed limit to 20mph across all of North Somerset to create a safer environment for walking and cycling and a greener, cleaner, healthier community.

20's Plenty North Somerset is a local campaign which began in 2021. The campaign is a branch of the nationwide 20's Plenty for Us organisation https://www.20splenty.org/ which has over 500 groups across the UK.

Bristol Airport: Bristol Airport Public Inquiry started on Tuesday, 20th July 2021 at Weston-super-Mare Town Hall. No formal date for announcement of the decision has been set but you can follow proceedings on You Tube via the Appeal website https://gateleyhamer-pi.com/en-gb/bristol-airport

The Queen's Green Canopy: *The Queen's Green Canopy* (QGC) is a unique tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 which invites people from across the United Kingdom to "Plant a Tree for the Jubilee." We are planning for Cleeve to be involved by planting a new tree on Pound Green.

We are currently seeking advice on a suitable tree species to be planted.

Pound Green: Following on from the movement to reduce mowing we are going to experiment with leaving part of Pound Green as a wild flower area. This will evolve over time but we would welcome any ideas you may have.

It is also going to be necessary for a cherry tree to be removed as this has succumbed to honey fungus.

Finally, as you may be aware, we still have a BT payphone on Pound Green and this has recently had a number of broken panes of glass replaced.

Flag Pole: It has been suggested that we acquire a flag pole for Cleeve to celebrate various occasions possibly to be placed at the Bishop's Road end of Pound Green and with a few planters around to make more of a feature.

We would welcome your thoughts/views on this.

Dog Poo!! Although most dog owners act responsibly there are still examples of instances of dog poo not always being picked up. Whilst this is, of course, anti-social it also is worth reminding dog owners that North Somerset Council have published local Public Space Protection Orders (PSPOs).

The orders state that if you are in charge of a dog you must as a minimum: keep your dog(s) under close control at all times - carry a poo bag - bag it and bin it – please don't leave bags hanging in trees or bushes - keep your dog(s) out of children's play areas.

Keep Cleeve Tidy: Our Village Orderly, Caroline, does a great job in keeping the village litter free (although this is often an uphill task!). We would be interested to hear if there are any areas of the village which you feel need any special attention at any time. VAST - VILLAGES ALLIANCE FOR SUSTAINABLE TRANSPORT

Residents in Churchill and Langford, Sandford and Winscombe have formed a new group, the Villages Alliance for Sustainable Transport, VAST, to campaign for a better deal for villagers in North Somerset on transport and traffic management.

VAST invites residents and transport groups in the other North Somerset villages to join them in working with North Somerset Council to get action on 2 key issues, the urgent need to reduce traffic and transport emissions in line with North Somerset's climate emergency targets, and urgently improving transport and traffic management in the villages.

VAST is calling on North Somerset Council to:

develop a Transport Strategy and Transport Action Plan aligned with its Climate Emergency Net Zero Carbon target of 2030 effective for the whole of the county including the villages, to include a shift to public transport.

prioritise the decarbonisation of transport throughout North Somerset, assessing all transport decisions including procurement decisions for their carbon cost, with an annual reduction target towards 2030, and six-month review and reports on progress,

urgently review all major infrastructure projects including the Banwell Bypass, taking into account their carbon cost of construction and operation and their individual impact on North Somerset's carbon budget and Net Zero target of 2030.

Tulip Bulbs

Tulip batalinii 'Bright Gem'



PLANT OF THE MONTH NOVEMBER 2021 - TULIP BULBS

Tulips might not be the first plant you think of in November but it is the perfect time of year to plant tulip bulbs. The cooler weather helps prevent the spread of *Botrytis tulipae* the fungus that causes Tulip Fire Disease. Spores can survive in the soil in warmer months, ruining future blooms with distorted leaves and brown spots.

Tulips thrive in full sun or part shade and are ideal for pots and borders. Try planting your bulbs in layers in a container, alongside other spring bulbs like narcissus and crocus; known as lasagne planting, as one bulb fades the next variety flowers in succession so you have continuous blooms throughout spring.

Plant your bulbs twice the depth of the length of the bulb, this helps protect from frost and from being dug up by inquisitive wildlife. The bulb has enough energy stored to grow to the surface before needing to photosynthesis.

Try petite *Tulip batalinii* 'Bright Gem' ideal for rockeries at 15cm tall, exotic fringed tulips like Black Parrot, classic 'Queen of Night' or 'Apeldoorn,' two-tone *Tulip clusiana* or 'Carnaval de Rio, '*Tulip bakerii* 'Lilac Wonder' naturalises well in lawns, and for outstanding beauty peony tulips such as 'Foxtrot' and 'La Belle Époque' intensify in colour as they age.

Get down to your local nursery and let your imagination run wild planning a colourful 2022.
