

CLEEVE COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH.

You may have seen us standing by the side of the road in Cleeve, wearing bright yellow jackets and monitoring the speed of the traffic as it passes by.

We are the Cleeve Community Speedwatch Group.

The Group was formed in January 2019. We have 5 roadside sites (4 in Cleeve and 1 in Claverham). Since its formation the Group has conducted over 250 roadside speedwatch sessions. Speedwatch Groups are trained by, and come under the auspices of the Avon and Somerset Police.

Over the last couple of years the Cleeve Group has managed to keep going with just 5 members. However, by the end of 2024 we were down to 4 members. This is insufficient members for us to fulfil our commitment of one speedwatch session per week and, with regret, the Group has suspended its activities for the time being.

We are hopeful that if there were to be some changes of speed limit within Cleeve, then with renewed enthusiasm, and some new members we could reform.



First of all, our next volunteer date:

Winter Warmer at Goblin Combe Saturday 8th February 2025 10am - 2pm

Yes, that's right, a Saturday this time. Many of you have mentioned that you can't make our weekday volunteering but would love to join us if we ever needed help on a weekend, so here it is.

We're running an 'Open Homes' event in collaboration with the Centre for Sustainable Energy in Bristol, where we will be providing information, advice and guided tours all about energy use and improvements. Visitors will also be able to use our thermal imaging camera, air quality monitor, and we'll be providing forest school sessions, popcorn and hot chocolate around the fire and warm winter soup too - and that's where you come in! We'll need some help in preparing the soup in the kitchen, serving refreshments, manning the firepits, ushering visitors at the gates and parking. It should be a great day.

I'll shortly be sending round a poster/flier for people to share to spread the word, and there will be a sign up website for me to keep track of numbers, so if you can come it would be great if you can reply to that.

Lodge Site News

We had a lovely volunteer day on 24th October and worked our little socks off to erect a new bin store and install brand new mattresses in the lodge. Thanks to faces old and new for your sterling efforts, it was quite impressive what our little team achieved!

With funding from Bristol Airport, we are now lined up to update all our lights to LEDs and install electric points to the yurt and lodge during January - we're looking forward to lower energy bills this year! All the windows and doors in the lodge will also be renovated in the next couple of months from the same funding, to keep us energy efficient and water-tight. We'll also be making some upgrades to our kitchen with funding from North Somerset Rural Prosperity Fund, so look out for a new oven, dishwasher and storage coming soon too.

TIPS FROM CLEEVE NURSERY

Gather up and bin (don't compost) diseased leaves from under roses and fruit. This will help to limit the carry-over of disease from one season to the next. Applying a generous mulch helps to suppress the disease infection too. 'Revive' or chipped bark is perfect for this.

Check tree ties and stakes. Adjust those that are too tight and tighten those that are not! Make sure the top tie is near to the top of the stake so that it prevents the tree rubbing. Make certain that the stake is still sound and that it isn't the tree that is holding the stake up!

Wash the glass down to allow maximum amount of light to enter. By using a sterilant such as Jeyes Fluid you will also kill any over wintering pests such as red spider mite and their eggs.

CHAPEL GROUND ALPACAS

My husband and I started with 3 white girls back during Covid. The three girls were my Christmas present, and we collected them from Hertfordshire on the 23rd of December 2020. We were allowed to travel to a red zone for animal welfare.

I was warned that they were very addictive and 3 has become 43. Some are co-owned with our Dutch friends. There are 2 breeds of Alpaca, Suri and Huacaya. The Suri's are rarer and distinguishable by their dreadlock like fleeces which hang down. The Huacaya's look much fluffier. We keep Boys and Girls although they must be kept separately and pretty much every colour variation including the beautiful spotty Appaloosa's.

The Alpacas have adapted well to life in North Somerset, originally hailing from South America they are used to vast differences in temperature. They are from the Camelid Family and are often mistaken for Llamas. The difference between them is the size, Llamas are much bigger and were bred for load bearing whilst Alpacas are bred for their beautiful fleeces. Their diet is mainly based on grass and hay although we feed hard pellets with added vitamin and minerals. Their favourite treats are carrots and apples but more than anything dried, flaked peas. Although hardy animals they are susceptible to poisoning, garden plants can be highly toxic as can ragwort. They can live beyond 25 in exceptional circumstance, our oldest girl April Showers will be 21 in April. A more average age maybe 17-18.

If you visit Goblin Combe you will see the Alpacas on the field at Chapel Lane, often on the hill at the entrance to our woods and on 2 field along Cleeve Hill Road. From January 2025 we will start showing the Alpacas and already own a champion that was born here.



PLANT OF THE MONTH - CYCLAMEN

Looking for a pop of vivid colour throughout winter? Well look no further than cyclamen; whether you want a lovely potted houseplant or some colour under a tree, cyclamen have got it covered.

The name cyclamen originates from the Greek word 'kuklos', meaning 'circle' in English and refers to the plant's flattened, round tubers which the roots and shoots grow from. Cyclamen are perennial plants, often fragrant and part of the primrose family, Primulaceae.

There are around 23 species of *Cyclamen* in a range of sizes and colours from red, pink, purple or white. *C. persicum* has heart-shaped leaves; the wild variety grows in open shrub or rocky hillsides but the nursery-grown varieties have tiny tubers, favouring warmth and sun and need to be treated as houseplants (often known as florist's cyclamen), they will not survive outdoors whereas *C. hederifolium* and *C. coum* are hardy plants that thrive outside in dappled shade and should come back every year.

C. coum have petite flowers, delicately rising above rounded, kidney-shaped leaves, blooming in January, February and March whereas *C. hederifolium* have larger flowers that start flowering from autumn with dark green, silver-lined leaves that are almost ivy-like in appearance. Some *C. hederifolium* flower before the leaves and others have flowers and foliage appearing at the same time.

Cyclamen hederifolium roots from the top and sides of their tubers whereas *C. persicum* and *C. coum* root from the bottom. All these plants have evolved to bloom facing downwards; this survival mechanism protects the flower's pollen from washing away in rain storms. Nature thinks of everything! Grab yourself a cyclamen whether as a houseplant or for a shady garden spot and enjoy months of cheery colourful blooms.
